



WHO CAN ENROLL?

- ❖ Families that live in Roanoke City, Roanoke County, Salem, Bedford County, Botetourt County or Craig County
- ❖ Families (parents, guardians, grandparents, etc.) that have 1 or more children under the age of 4, or are expecting a child
- ❖ Child or family has Medicaid or is eligible for Medicaid
- ❖ Guardian who is available for a home visit Monday-Friday between the hours of 8 AM – 5 PM

Health Care Coordination

- 1 to 2 monthly visits in the convenience of your own home; coordinated care throughout the month
- Assistance finding a doctor and/or dentist for your child; assistance with referrals if extra support or services may be needed
- Support & education for children with asthma, such as education on how to use prescribed medications, recognize asthma triggers and reduce the number of ER visits
- Support & education for children with chronic medical conditions or developmental delays; monthly nurse visit for children who were in the NICU after birth
- Coordination to keep children up-to-date on immunizations and well-child visits

Family Strengthening Support Services

- Prenatal/Pregnancy Education to promote healthy birth weight and development for child, prenatal care for mother's health and screenings for postpartum depression
- Health & Safety Education on topics such as oral health, nutrition, safe sleep, injury prevention
- Assistance & support for family goal setting
- Referrals & coordination with other community resources
- Back-up transportation to medical/dental or other child-related appointments (*must be pre-approved*)

Mental Health Therapy

- Play Therapy is the clinically recommended treatment offered for enrolled children ages 3-5
- Enrolled caregivers will receive traditional therapy utilizing common and specialized evidence-based therapeutic modalities
- Mental Health Therapy is offered to enrolled children and caregivers on a weekly, no less than bi-weekly basis. Therapy is offered using a hybrid model with most sessions occurring in-office with options for telehealth (e.g., Zoom and telephone) under special circumstances

Kindergarten Readiness

- Check points to ensure literacy and reading skills are achieved and appropriate developmental milestones are met
- Enrolled child receives a book at monthly home visits
- Support to ensure that children have all documentation and immunizations required to enter kindergarten
